If that tournament happens to be abroad, then the stories will be that much more exciting—and you might even get to claim a bit of inspired patriotism as well. In the case of next year's Ryder Cup, which pits a team of U.S. men against a team of European men, the setting couldn't be better: Le Golf National in Paris, France. And while you'll want to see the competition, you should stick around for the country's great food and wine, stunning vistas and golfing opportunities. All of that can be found in Provence, and specifically at the Terre Blanche Hôtel Spa Golf Resort, which might be the greatest getaway ever. See Paris, certainly, but make time to travel south to the Côte d'Azur because there,

France really opens up.
